
Meet the Teacher – Tuesday 25th September (Drop in 3:30 p.m-5 p.m)

Reception 2019 Admissions

If your child turns five between 1st September 2019 and 31st August 2020 you need to apply for a school place (for whichever Primary School you would like them to attend) via http://www.durham.gov.uk/schooladmissions. Please note if you want your child to attend Belmont C of E Primary for Reception you must still apply for a place even if your child attends Nursery here. Applications opened on 12th September and close on 15th January 2019. Parents are advised to apply via this system, and to not apply via a paper application form. The Local Authority have asked us not to accept any paper applications and send them in on parents' behalf.
