Dear parents and carers,

We have had a fantastic couple of weeks back in school. Every day, the children continue to amaze us and make us smile. They are all doing extremely well and we continue to be proud of them. We have had a visit from our Diocesan School Improvement Partner and our Local Authority School Improvement Partner and on both of their visits, they commented on how happy, settled and well behaved our children are. They are extremely happy with our school and say that it is very warm and welcoming. Last week, we asked the children to complete a wellbeing survey because we wanted to know their views since they have returned to school. We also asked them if they would like us to do anything else to help them feel happy, safe and settled. The results have been very pleasing as over 92% of our children said they feel happy, safe and settled since returning to school in September. Other comments raised included getting up early on a morning and missing family and pets at home. I'm sure that when the children are fully embedded in their new school routines, this percentage will continue to rise.

We continue to have some positive cases across school in both children and staff, but thankfully, they do seem to have slowed down slightly this week. We will continue to implement our mitigation measures in school to minimise the spread in the whole school community.

This week, Governors will start the recruitment process for an Assistant Head Teacher to increase the leadership capacity in school as we work towards opening our new school. I will keep you updated on this process.

Unfortunately, we have had a few staff members test positive for Covid since the start of the term. As a result, this has meant a change of teacher or Teaching Assistant for some classes. Reception 2022 Admissions

For children born between 1 September 2017 and 31 August 2018, you will need to complete an application, stating which primary school you would like your child to attend. You still need to apply even if you have an older child attending the same school, and even if you attend Noah's Ark Nursery at Belmont C of E Primary, you must still apply for a Reception place. The deadline for applications is midnight on Friday, 15 January 2022. The offer of school places will be made on 19th April 2022. Applications must be made via

Applying for a Secondary School Place 2022

For children born between 1 September 2010 and 31 August 2011, you need to complete an application, stating which secondary school you would like your child to attend. The application process opened on September 14th and you will have received a letter regarding this (sent to Year 6 parents via Parentmail). The deadline for secondary school applications is midnight on Sunday 31 October 2021. Once again, it is very important to apply for a secondary school place by the deadline, as a late application greatly reduces your chances of getting a place at your preferred school. <u>Twitter</u>

We would love to receive your comments and photographs online, but request that you use generic terms such as my child, my son, my daughter etc. when commenting about specific children.

I do think that our Twitter feed has really helped to keep our community together during a really tough 18 months when we have been forced to be physically apart.

Water Bottles

Please remember to send your child with their school water bottle every day. We do continue to send the water bottles home to be cleaned and filled every day however, it is essential that these are brought back to school daily. If your child forgets their water bottle, please do not worry - we always have cups we can give the children.

Blended Learning

Blended Learning is another new phrase which has now become part of our everyday vocabulary! As a school, we have to prepare for the possibility of children needing to self-isolate for up to 10 days if testing positive for Covid-19. In addition to this, we expect to have some children needing to isolate until they receive a test and their test results. So, to try to ensure your child's education is as fluid and consistent as possible, this is our pledge to you:

• For children who are isolating when waiting for a test. There are a number of activities and websites that your child can access. These can be completed during the first day of absence. Following this, please email the school office or your child's class teacher and they will email you with the work missed in school.

• For children needing to self-isolate for 10 days. Work will be sent via Parentmail. If your child is too poorly to complete their work, just let us know.

• If your child has to isolate but does not have access to technology during the day, please let us know. We do have some laptops we can loan out and we can also provide work packs and books if you prefer.

• If your child is absent from school as they are poorly and not well enough to attend school, then they are not well enough to complete work at home and work will not be set for them. If you have any questions at all about any of this, please do not hesitate to ask!

COVID-19 Information Advice to All Parents and Carers

We have a number of confirmed cases of COVID-19 within the school. NHS test and trace have been in contact with individuals who have been identified as a close contact to let them know if they are legally required to self-isolate, and to provide further advice. How to stop coronavirus (COVID-19) spreading:

There are things you can do to help reduce the risk of you and anyone you live with getting ill with coronavirus (COVID-19):

- get vaccinated everyone aged 16 and over can book COVID-19 vaccination appointments now
- wash your hands with soap and water or use hand sanitiser regularly throughout the day
- · cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze
- put used tissues in the bin immediately and wash your hands afterwards
- meet people outside and avoid crowded areas
- open doors and windows to let in fresh air if meeting people inside

 \cdot wear a face covering when it's hard to stay away from other people – particularly indoors or in crowded places

• participate in twice weekly LFD testing following national guidelines (recommended for 11 years and over). We encourage you to log your results here: <u>https://www.gov.uk/log-test-site-covid19-results</u>

Isolation

From 16th August 2021, children under 18 (or double-vaccinated adults) do not need to selfisolate or miss school if a member of their household or a contact, has Covid. Instead, they will need to book a PCR test but can continue coming to school until they get the test result, as long as they have no symptoms.

Communication with School

It continues to be important that if your child has to go for a PCR test, please inform the school office of this:

Although schools are no longer required to 'Track and Trace', we are still expected to have this information and may be contacted by Public Health to assist them. Thank you.

We are delighted to celebrate our Harvest Festival in church with Revd Heather Murray. This will take place on Monday 18th October during the morning and afternoon. This will be for children from Years Nursery-Year 6 this year. Many of our children have not been to church yet and the majority of our children didn't visit church with school last year.
